The annual BIPP International Photographic Awards are now justifiably considered to be amongst the most prestigious in the professional photography industry and may be entered by any BIPP member worldwide.

The awards are divided into eight different categories of photography and each entry is judged to an international scoring system by a panel of expert judges. For this competition there was a total entry of over 800 photographs and this exhibition comprises those images that scored 85 or higher. Fifteen of the images achieved a score of 90 or higher and these are designated with a gold star.

In addition to the 65 prints that form the main exhibition, there is a display under the new category "The Art of Science", reflecting the striking imagery coming from this important branch of photography.

Founded in 1901, the British Institute of Professional Photography enjoys worldwide recognition as the profession's major qualifying body.
