## REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES 2014

Notice is hereby given that Harlow District Council is to carry out a review of polling districts and polling places within the District of Harlow.

The purpose of the review is to seek to ensure that:

- all electors in Harlow have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances; and
- so far as reasonable and practicable, the polling places in Harlow are accessible to all electors, including those who are disabled.

The (Acting) Returning Officer for Harlow has reviewed the polling districts and polling places and does not intend to propose any changes.

Any elector in Harlow may make representations in relation to the size and boundaries of polling districts and the location and suitability of polling places within them. In addition, the Council would welcome comments or representations from:

- the MP for Harlow, district councillors and county councillors representing electors within Harlow
- election agents, local political parties and past or potential candidates
- any person or organisation with expertise in access for persons with any type of disability
- organisations or individuals who are responsible for buildings used as a polling place or could be used for this purpose.

The consultation period will commence on 16 June 2014 and all representations must be received by 29 August 2014.
