Great Parndon is Harlow's least populated ward.

The average age of its residents is 41 years, the oldest in Harlow.

The predominant ethnic group is White: British with 86% of the population.

The size of the ward's population declined at the fastest rate in Harlow.

Population

Great Parndon has a population of 6543, making it the least populated ward in Harlow, housing fewer than 8% of the Town's residents. It has a male/female ratio of 49:51, which is broadly in line with the Harlow average.

Trends & Comparisons

In the decade 2001 to 2011, Great Parndon's population decreased by over 3%, from 6777 to 6543. This was the second highest rate of decline in Harlow, second only to Sumners and Kingsmoor and well below the 4% growth seen throughout Harlow as a whole.

It was Harlow's second least populated ward in 2001 but substantial growth in Old Harlow, saw Great Parndon become Harlow's smallest ward by the end of the decade.

Age Distribution

Great Parndon has the oldest overall population in Harlow with an average age of 41 years, this is older than the Town average of 38.

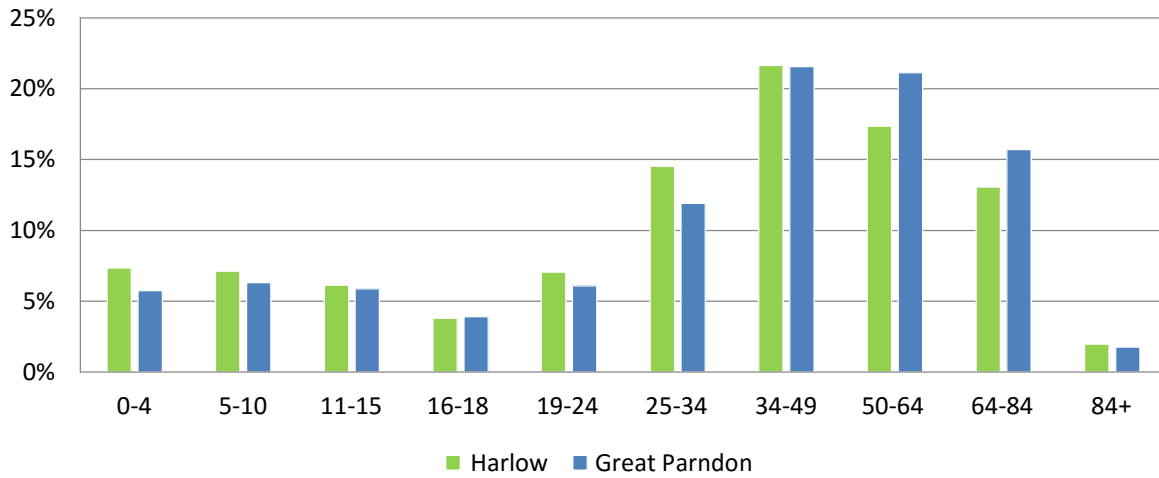
The predominant age bands are 45-49 and 60-64. Great Parndon has the smallest proportion of infants of all wards in Harlow, with less than 6% of its population being under 5 years of age, compared to over 7% Town wide.

QS103EW – Age by single year

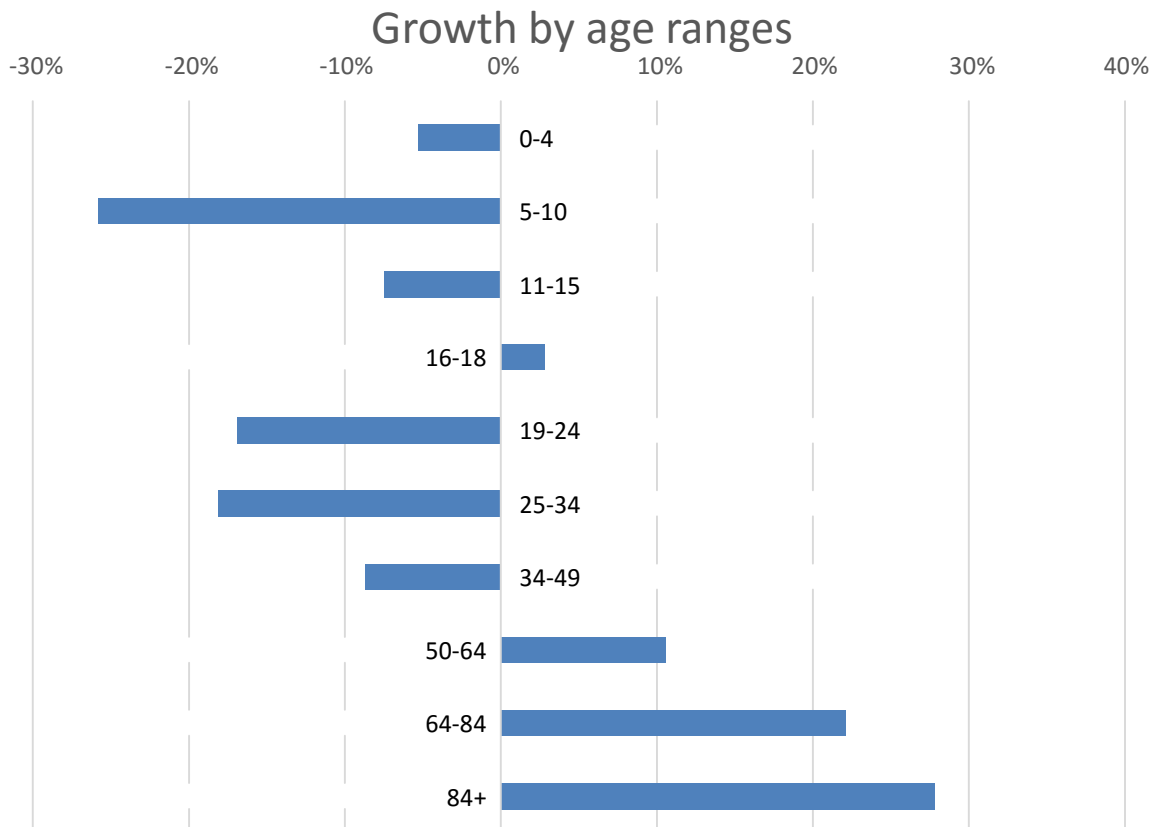
Despite having the most aged population of any ward in Harlow, Great Parndon has a relatively low proportion of residents over 84 years of age. Less than 2% of its residents fall into this demographic, the fourth lowest proportion of all wards.

Age distribution compared to Harlow



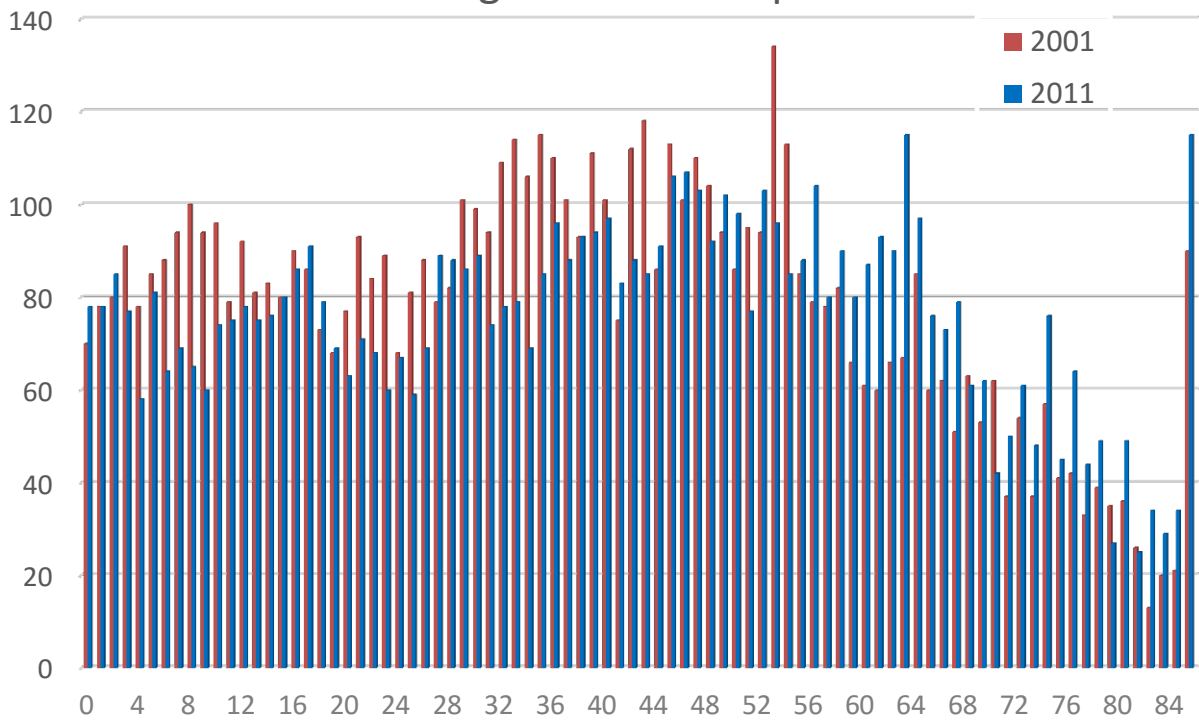
Trends

In the decade 2001-2011 Great Parndon saw the average age of its population rise from 38 to 41 years. Populations of children and younger adults declined significantly

Age distribution profiles



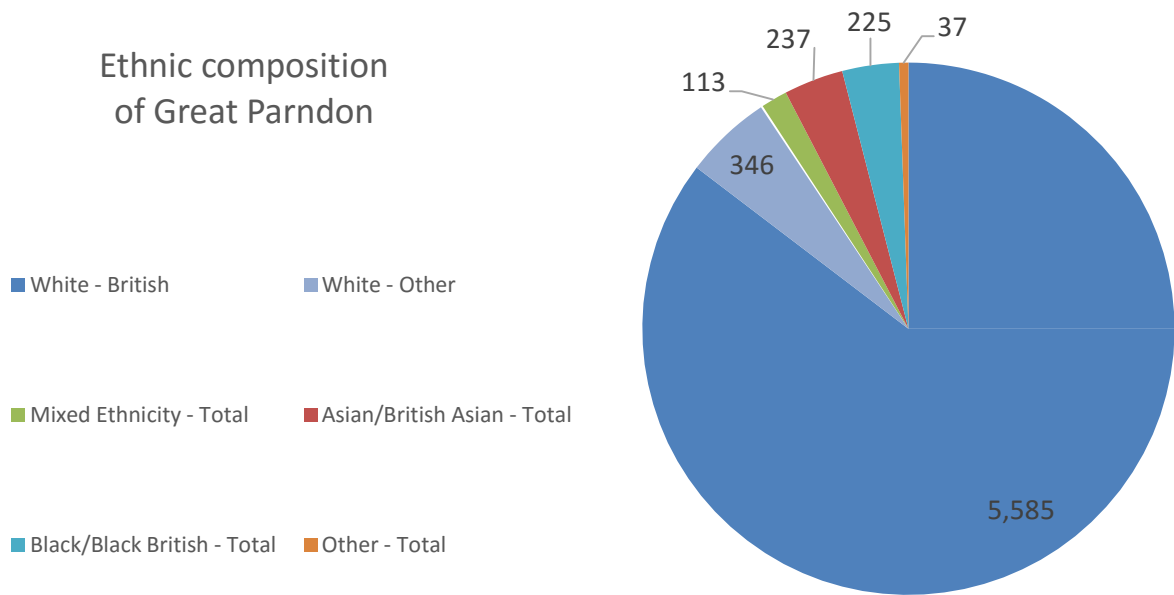
Ethnicity

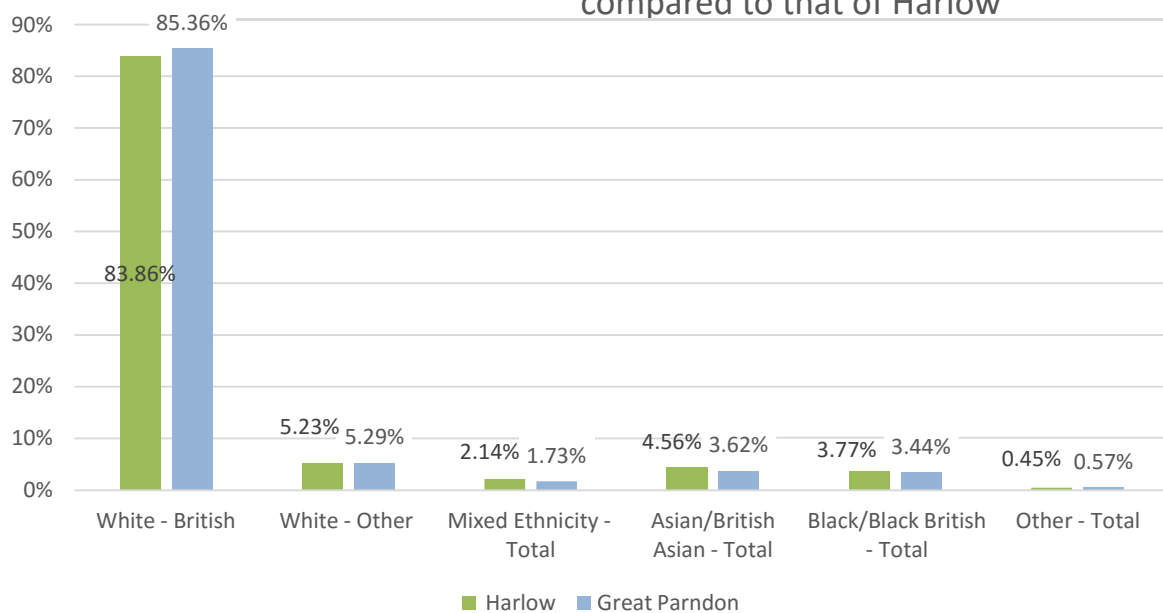
Ethnic composition of Great Parndon



In Comparison to Harlow

Great Parndon's ethnic composition compared to that of Harlow

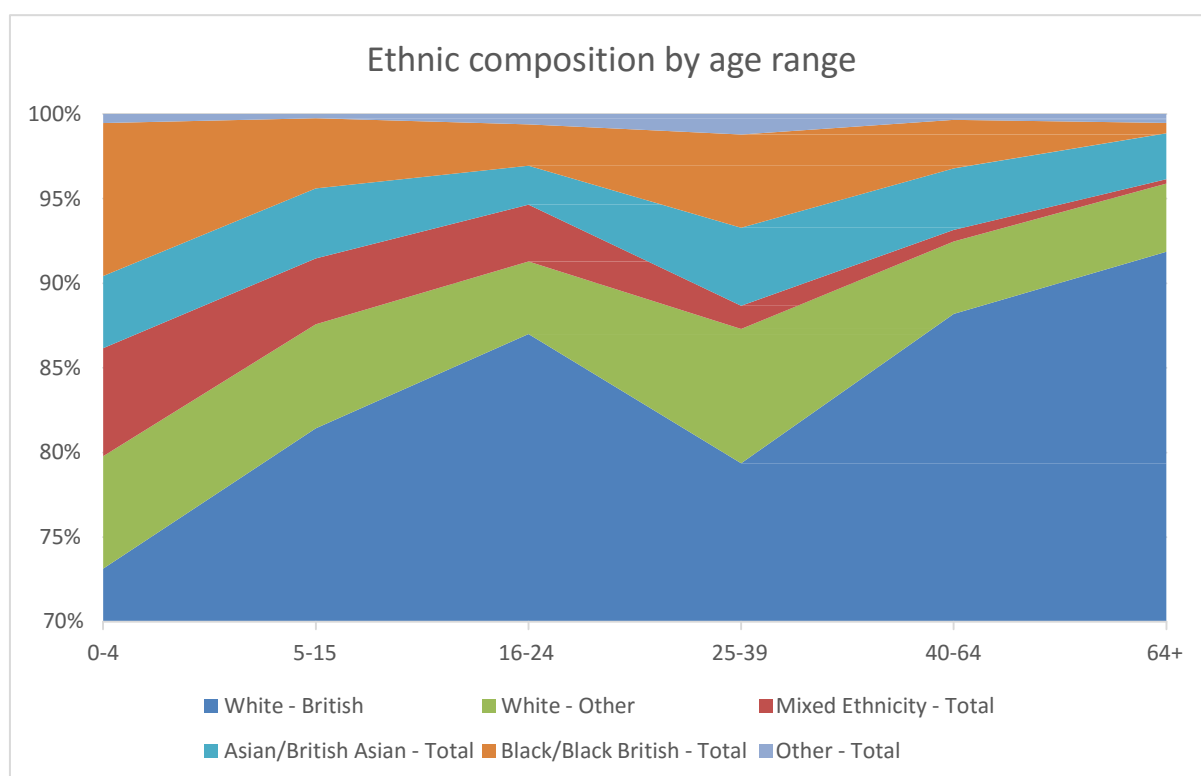


Ethnicity by Age

White British is the predominant ethnic group in each age range for Great Parndon. However the proportion of each ethnic group varies significantly through the age bands, as seen in the proportional area graph below.

Of the population aged 0 to 4 years of age, the proportion of *White British* residents is 73%, whilst for the population aged 64 and above, the proportion rises to 92%.

For residents under 16 years of age, over 9% are of *Black/Black British* ethnicity and almost 7% are *White – Other*.



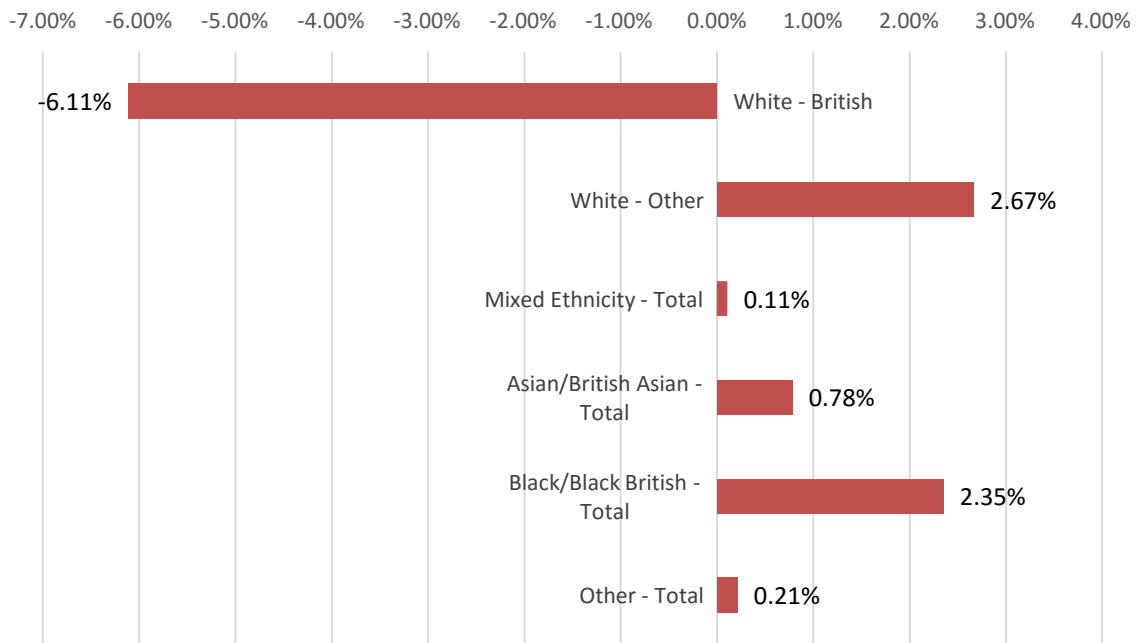

Nationalities

90% of Great Parndon's population were born in the United Kingdom, slightly above the Town average of 88%. Almost 2% of the ward's population come from countries in Southern Asia, predominantly Indian and Pakistan. These account for more than 17% of the ward's non-UK nationals. Over 31% of Great Parndon's non-UK nationals were born in Europe (including Ireland). The majority of these are from Countries admitted into the EU from 2001 to 2011.

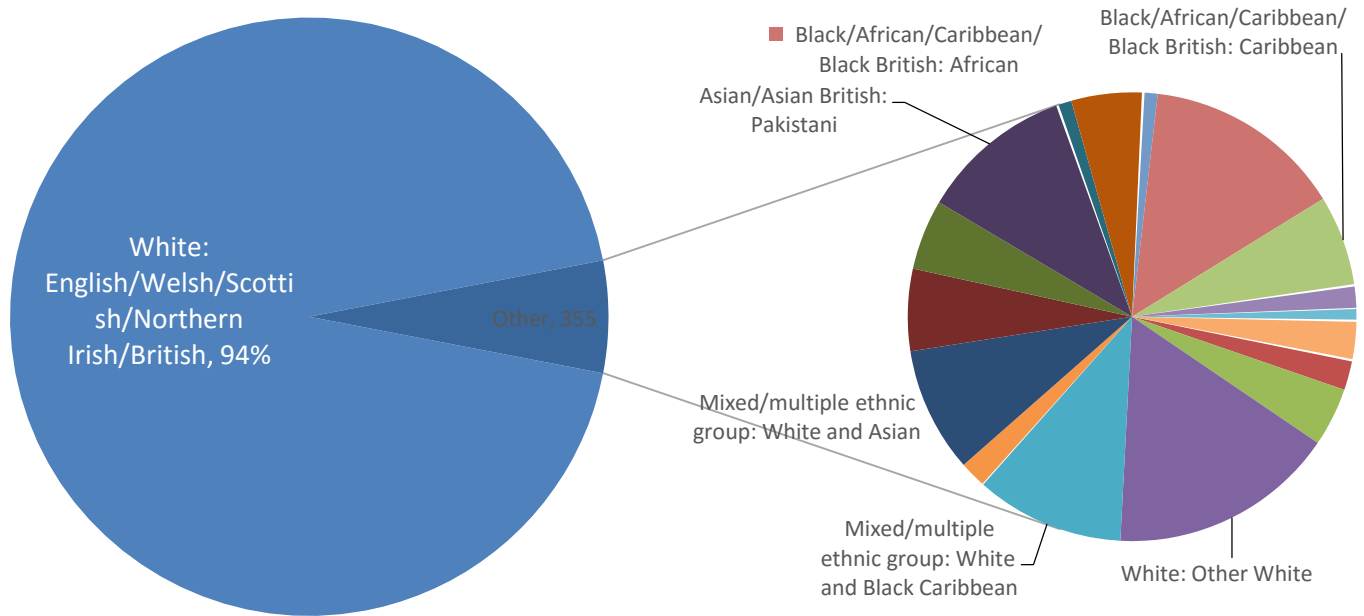
Like all but two wards in Harlow, Great Parndon saw its population of residents born in the United Kingdom fall in real terms and in proportion during the decade 2001-2011.

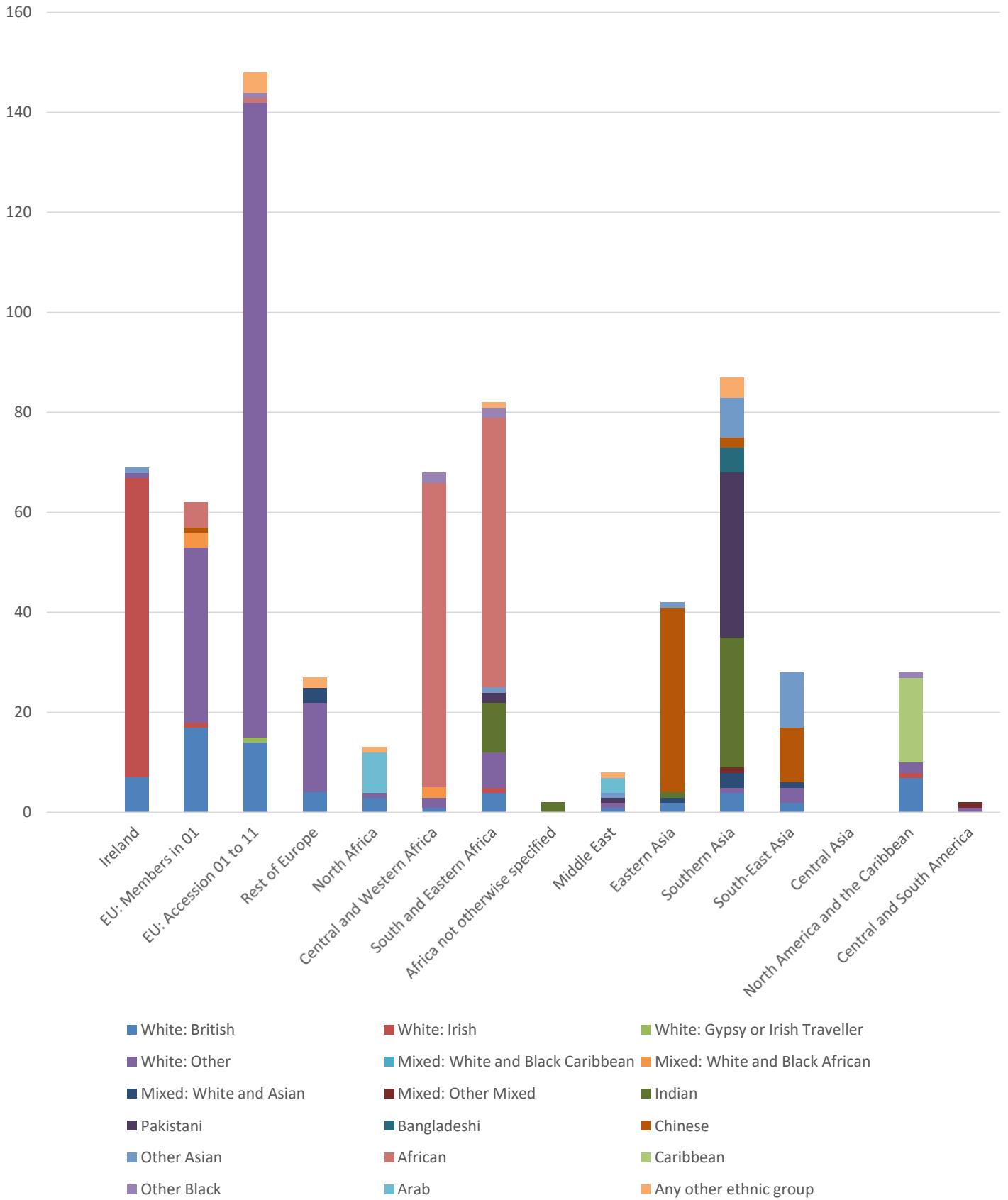

Ethnic composition of Great Parndon's nationalities (excluding UK)



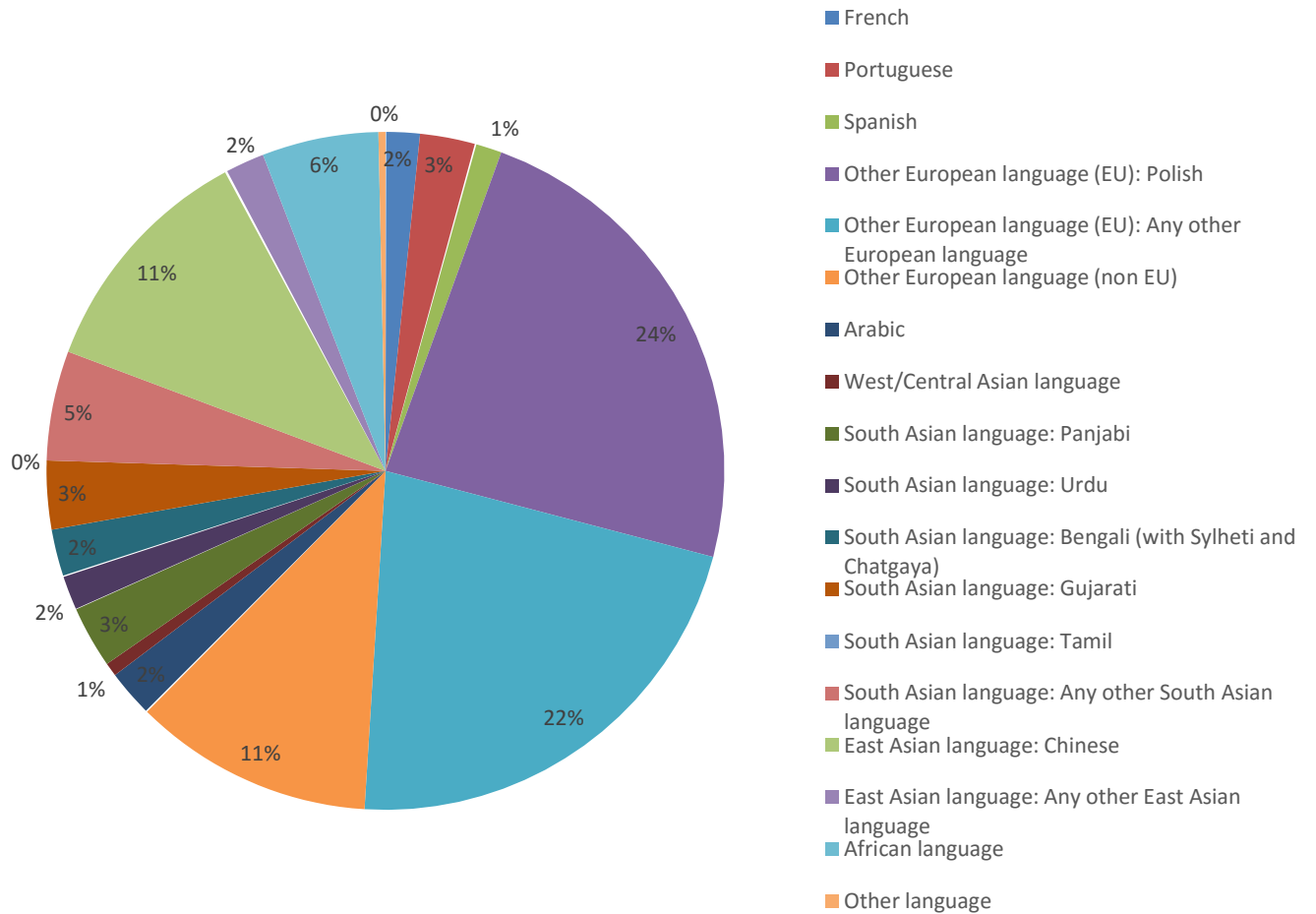
Languages spoken

Proficiency in English

Almost 5% of people over 3 years of age have a main language other than English. Of these 306 residents 77% can speak English either well or very well. 20% cannot speak English well, whilst 10 residents cannot speak English at all.

Religion

The predominant religion is Christianity with 59% of residents describing themselves as Christian. 31% describe themselves as having no religion. These proportions are in line with Harlow as a whole.

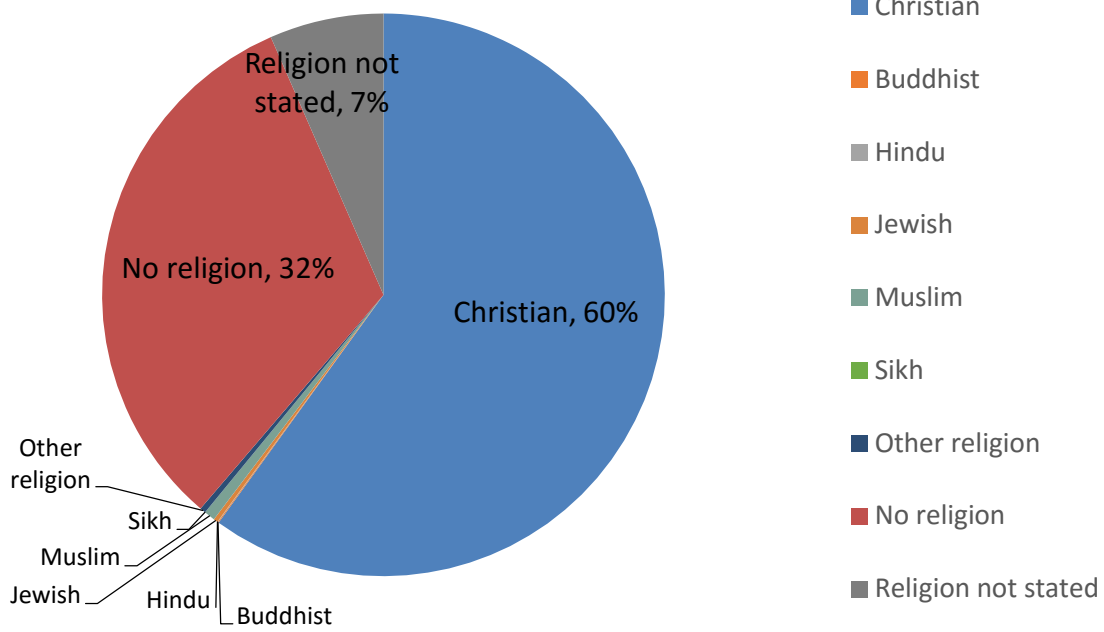

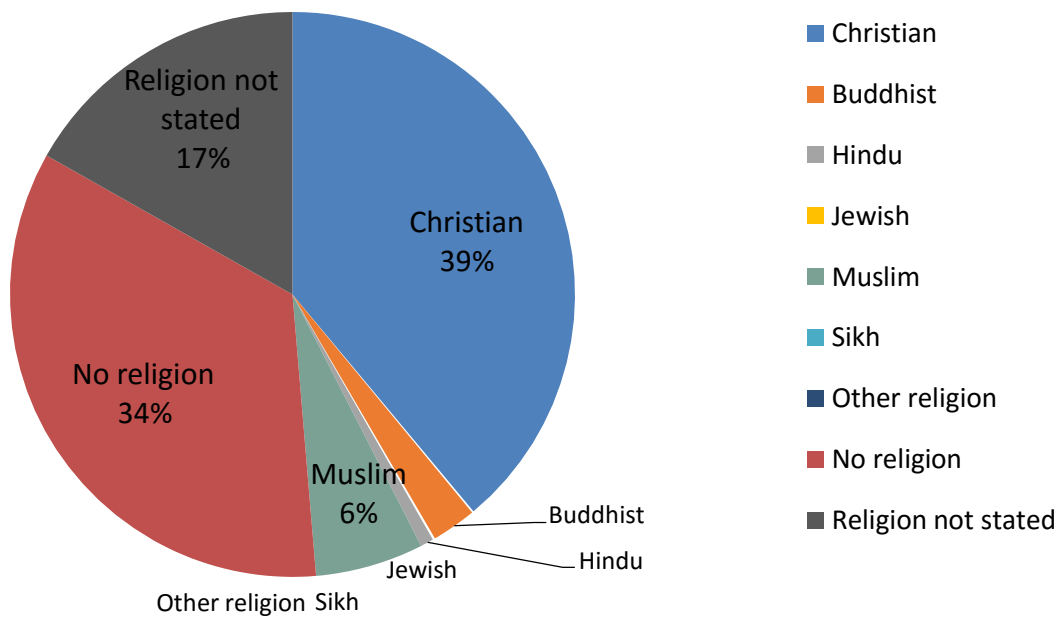
Since 2001 the number of Christians in Great Parndon has fallen by over 18%. This is a faster rate of decline than in Harlow overall, which saw the number of Christians decrease by over 14%. At the start of the decade approximately 21% of residents in Great Parndon and in Harlow described themselves as having No Religion. By 2011 this proportion had risen to 31%.

Religion within Ethnic groups

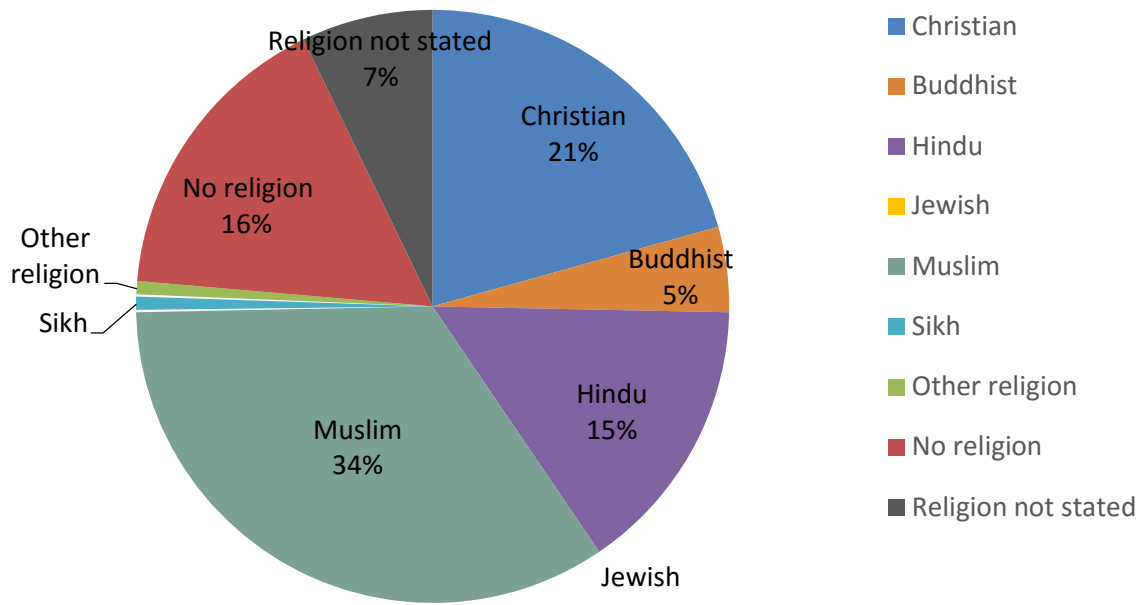

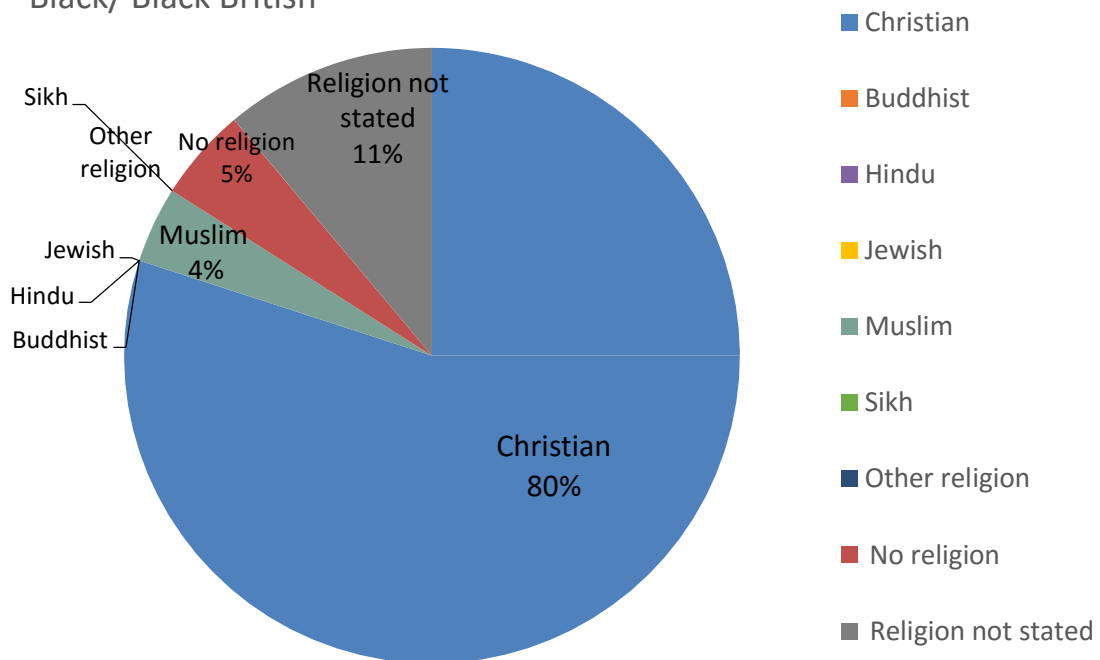

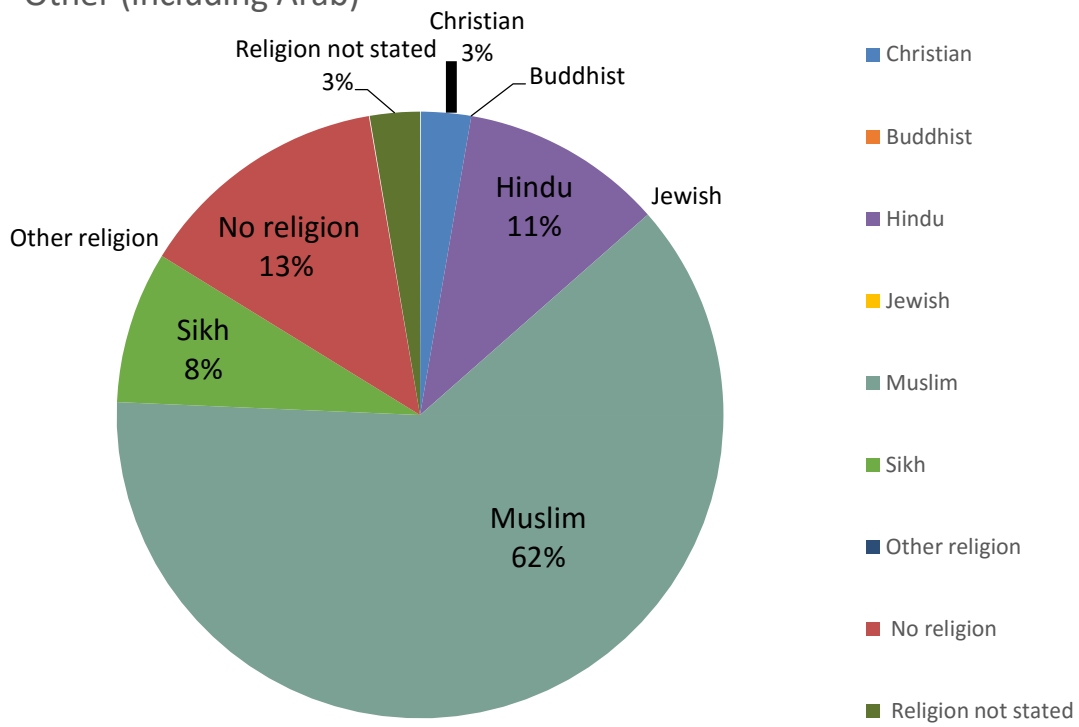

Household Composition

Great Parndon has 2821 households, the smallest number of any ward in Harlow. Of these households 64% consist of one family. This is in line with the town average of 63%.

Less than 28% of household are with dependent children, the lowest proportion of all wards and below the town average of 29.5%.

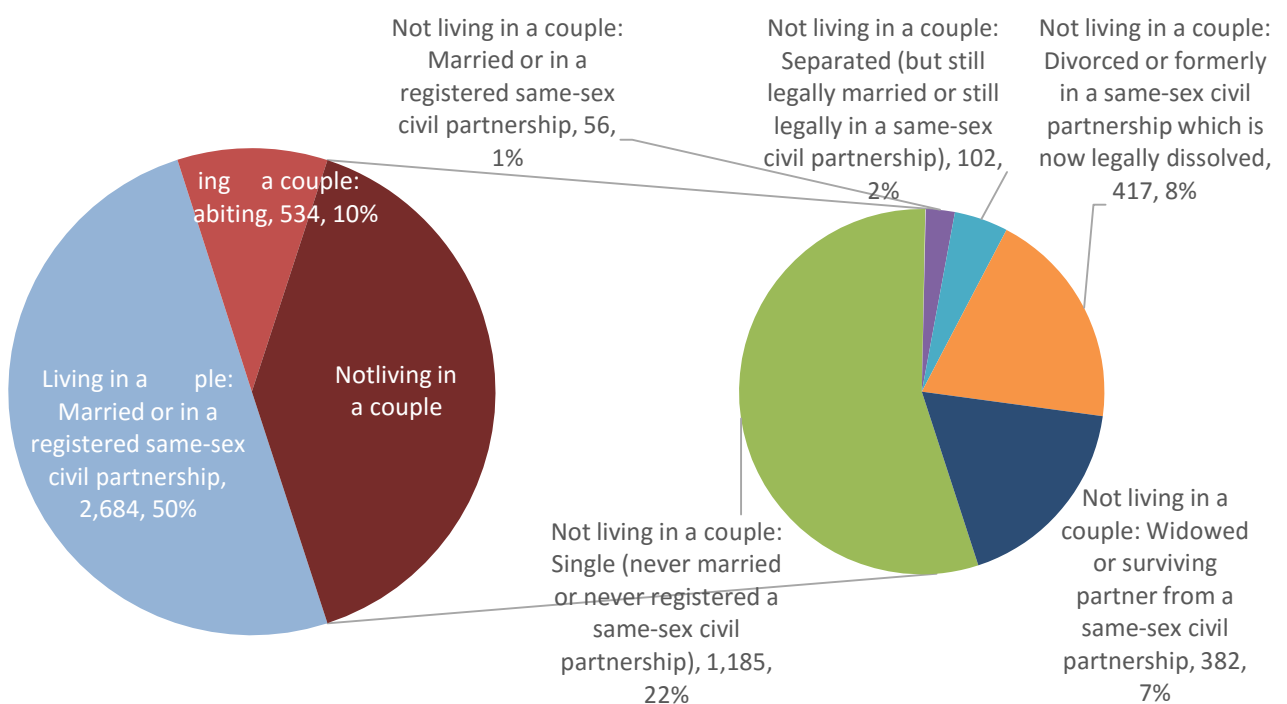

Of Great Parndon's residents aged 16 and over, 60% are living as a couple; the majority of whom are either married or living in a civil partnership.

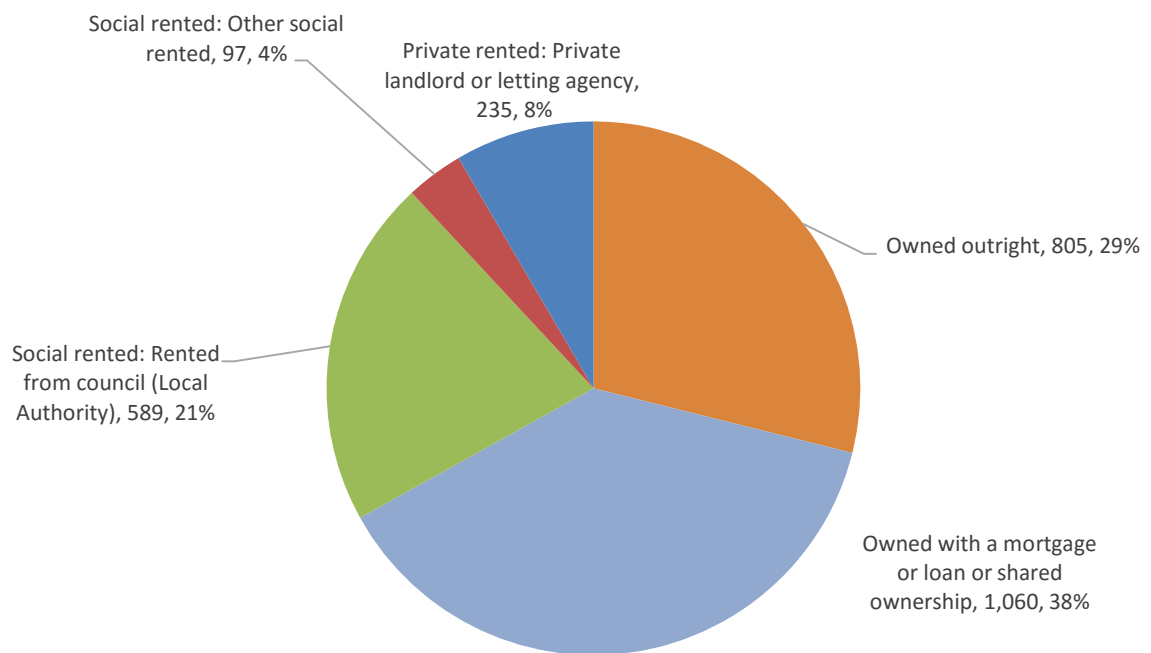


Tenure

Of Great Parndon’s 2821 households, 66% of properties are either owned outright or owned with a mortgage or loan. This is higher than the Town itself, where only 57% of residents own their dwelling.

Great Parndon also has one of the smallest ratios of social tenure in Harlow. Notably those renting from the council accounts for less than 21% of all households, whereas across Harlow 27% of all dwellings are rented from the council.

As expected, ownership varies greatly across the various ages bands. Amongst residents aged 16 to 34 less than 3% own their dwelling outright and only 43% own with a mortgage or through shared ownership. For residents over 64 years of age, over 63% own their dwellings of which 55% own them outright.

Qualifications

Great Parndon's levels of education correspond closely to those of Harlow overall. 18% of residents over 16 have achieved Level 4 qualifications or above both in the ward and the Town as a whole.

Likewise, 26% of Great Parndon's and Harlow's residents have no qualifications.

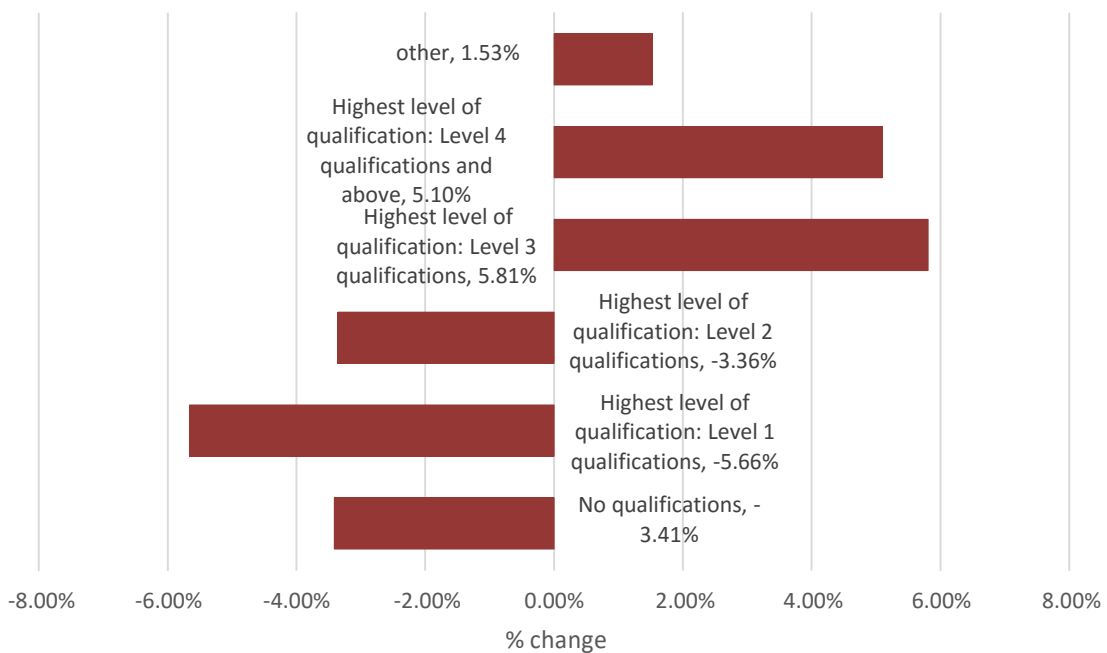

Trends

During the decade 2001 to 2011 there was a significant decrease in the proportion of Harlow's population who held no qualifications, with an average proportional decline of approximately 6%. In Great Parndon, however, the proportion of those without qualifications fell by only 3%.

So whilst Great Parndon mirrors Harlow's levels of qualification, its improvements have been less than those experienced by the Town as a whole.

Economic Activity

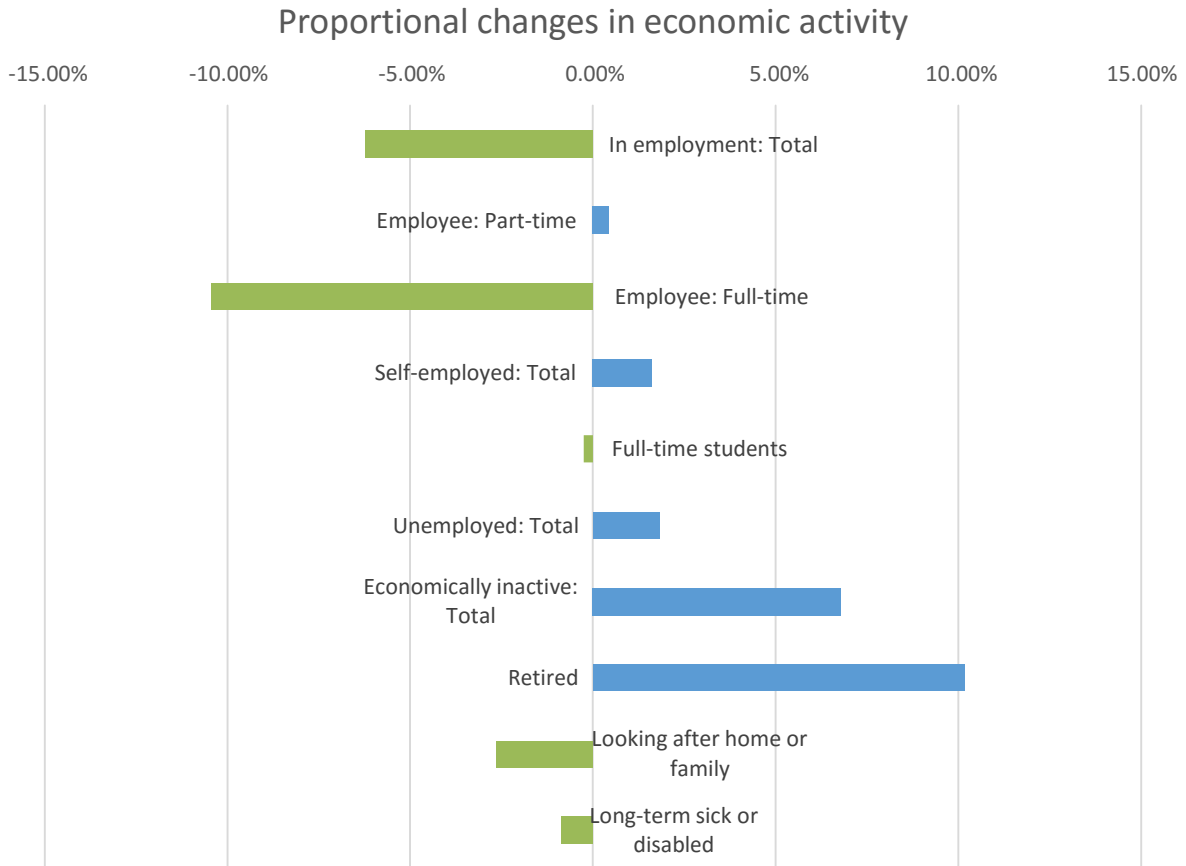
Of the ward's 5370 residents over the age of 16, 67% are economically active. 38% of residents over 16 are in full time employment, whilst 13% work part-time. 9% of the ward are self-employed. Only 5% of residents over 16 are unemployed. The third lowest unemployment rate in Harlow. 33% of residents are economically inactive, close to the Harlow average.

Trends

In the decade 2001 to 2011 unemployment in Great Parndon almost doubled. The percentage of residents aged 16 and over in employment fell from 68% to 62%. There was a significant increase in those who are economically inactive, predominantly due to the large increase in retirees.

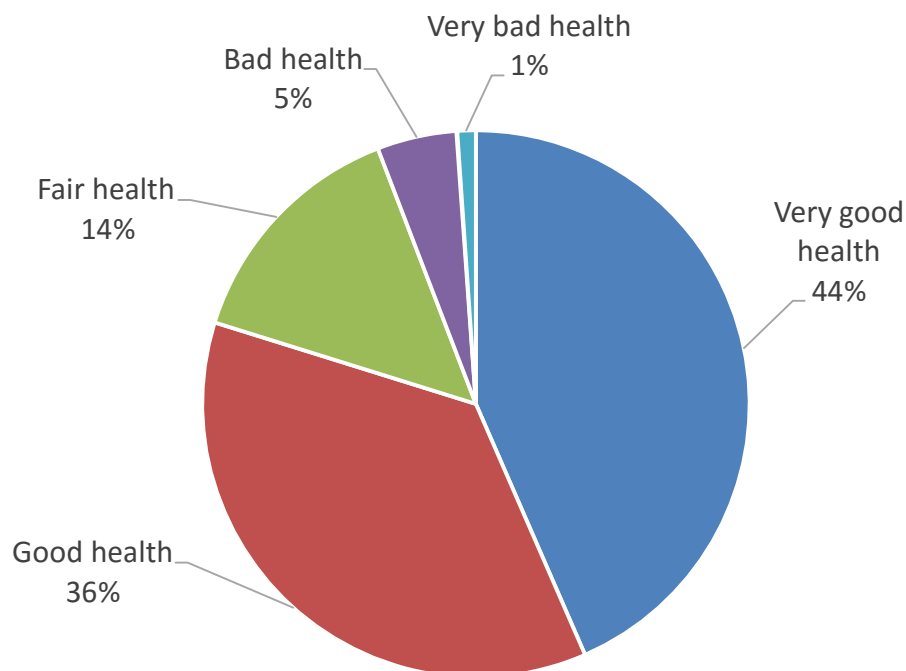

Health

Health in Great Parndon



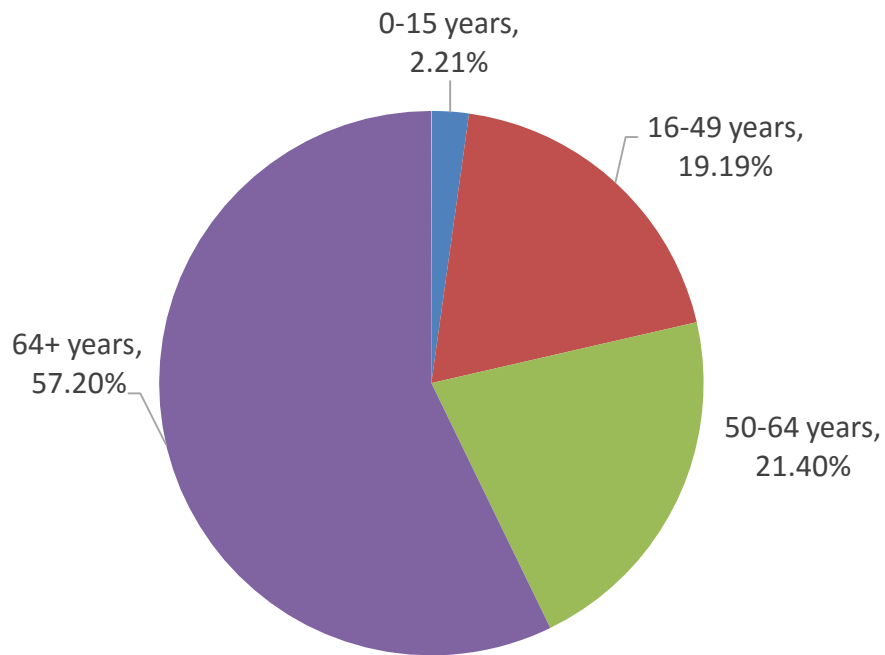

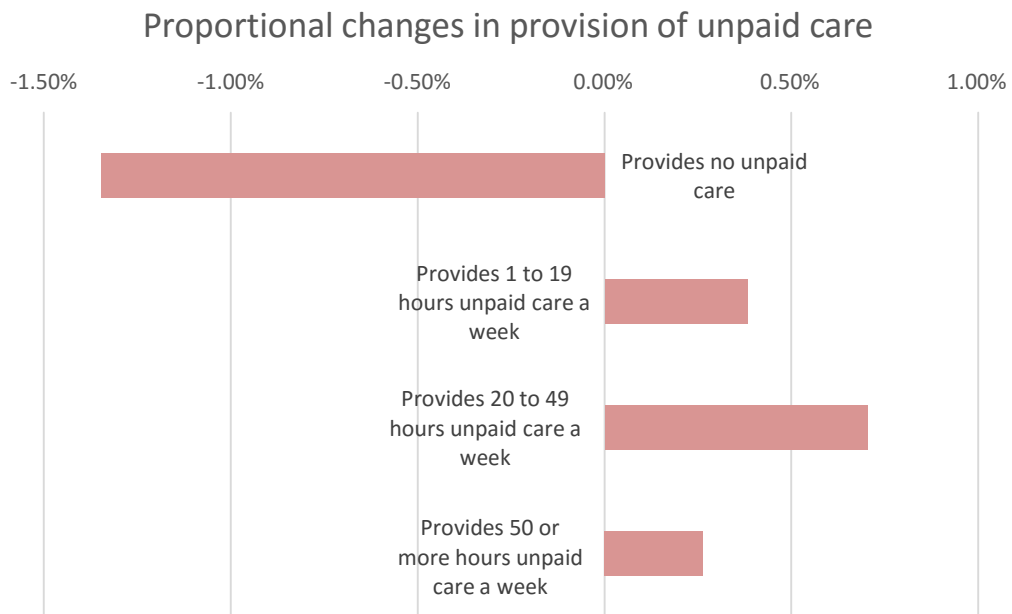
