

# **Basic facts about Harlow Common Ward**



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This report provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic and socio-economic make-up of the Harlow Common ward within Harlow district. It looks at the population structure and provides information on the economic, housing and educational achievement of the ward.

This sample report is part of a series of reports available from the Local Government Association's LG Inform Plus service. Other free reports include demographic and economic profiles of Harlow and a health and wellbeing profile which enables a side by side comparison of all wards in Harlow.


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Harlow Common is one of the 11 Wards of Harlow. It has an area of  $\underline{190 \text{ hectares}}$  which represents  $\underline{6.22\%}$  of the total area of Harlow district .



## **Residents**

The resident population of Harlow Common in 2021 was  $\underline{7,686}$  which represents  $\underline{8.24\%}$  of the total Harlow district resident population of  $\underline{93,328}$ .

Harlow Common's resident population is  $\underline{4,014}$  ( $\underline{52.2 \text{ people (per 100 people)}}$ ) female and  $\underline{3,672}$  ( $\underline{47.8 \text{ people (per 100 people)}}$ ) male.

Harlow Common has  $\underline{381}$  households with dependent children aged 0 to 4. That represents  $\underline{12.11\%}$  of the ward's households.  $\underline{1,018}$  households in the ward have dependent children of all ages. That represents  $\underline{32.37\%}$  of the ward's households.




## Age

The predominant age band in Harlow Common in 2020 was 'population aged 30-34' with  $\underline{564}$  people out of the total population of  $\underline{7,686}$ .

The mean age of the Harlow Common ward population was <u>40</u> years compared to a mean age of <u>38</u> years for residents in the whole of Harlow in 2011.

Population (unrounded) broken down by age band (5 year bands) (count) (Count) (2020) for Harlow Common




## **Ethnicity**

The largest ethnic group in Harlow Common in 2021 was 'Percentage of usual residents who are White' with 87.4 people (per 100 people) of the ward's population. That compares with a figure of 89.1% for Harlow district as a whole and 94.3% for Essex .

The second largest ethnic group was 'Percentage of usual residents who are Black/African/Caribbean/Black British' with  $\underline{4.6 \text{ people (per 100 people)}}$  of the ward's population. That compares with  $\underline{4.6\%}$  for the district as a whole and  $\underline{2.5\%}$  for Essex.




The ethnic split of Harlow Common's residents in 2021 is shown below.



#### Households

In 2021 Harlow Common ward had 3,145 households, which represent 8.31% of Harlow's 37,857 households. The household split by tenure is shown below.




The largest number of households lives in households owned with a mortgage or loan (%) accommodation with 30.9% of Harlow Common households. That compares with 30.7% for Harlow district as a whole and 32.7% for Essex.

The second largest number of households lives in households rented from council or equivalent



(%) accommodation with  $\underline{28.8\%}$  of the ward's households. That compares with  $\underline{23.9\%}$  for the district as a whole and  $\underline{7.2\%}$  for Essex.


## **Education**



<u>21.12 people (per 100 people)</u> of Harlow Common's residents have achieved level 4 qualifications and above compared to <u>24.44 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow as a whole and <u>23.44 people (per 100 people)</u> of Harlow Common's residents have no qualifications compared to <u>21.02 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow.

# Health






In 2021 Harlow Common had <u>314 (4.1 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in bad health and <u>115 (1.5 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in very bad health.

Its ranking for the number of residents in very bad health is 11 (out of 11 Wards) within Harlow.
