Basic facts about Little Parndon and Hare Street Ward Contents

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This report provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic and socio-economic make-up of the Little Parndon and Hare Street ward within Harlow district. It looks at the population structure and provides information on the economic, housing and educational achievement of the ward.

This sample report is part of a series of reports available from the Local Government Association's LG Inform Plus service. Other free reports include demographic and economic profiles of Harlow and a health and wellbeing profile which enables a side by side comparison of all wards in Harlow.


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Little Parndon and Hare Street is one of the 11 Wards of Harlow. It has an area of $\underline{560}$ hectares which represents $\underline{18.34\%}$ of the total area of Harlow district .



Residents

The resident population of Little Parndon and Hare Street in 2021 was <u>10,064</u> which represents <u>10.78%</u> of the total Harlow district resident population of <u>93,328</u>.

Little Parndon and Hare Street's resident population is <u>5,246</u> (<u>52.1 people (per 100 people)</u>) female and <u>4,818</u> (<u>47.9 people (per 100 people)</u>) male.

Little Parndon and Hare Street has $\underline{503}$ households with dependent children aged 0 to 4. That represents $\underline{14.93\%}$ of the ward's households. $\underline{1,432}$ households in the ward have dependent children of all ages. That represents $\underline{36.66\%}$ of the ward's households.




Age

The predominant age band in Little Parndon and Hare Street in 2020 was 'population aged 30-34' with <u>850 people</u> out of the total population of <u>10,064</u>.

The mean age of the Little Parndon and Hare Street ward population was <u>37</u> years compared to a mean age of <u>38</u> years for residents in the whole of Harlow in 2011.

Population (unrounded) broken down by age band (5 year bands) (count) (Count) (2020) for Little Parndon and Hare Street




Ethnicity

The largest ethnic group in Little Parndon and Hare Street in 2021 was 'Percentage of usual residents who are White' with $74.0 \, \text{people}$ (per 100 people) of the ward's population. That compares with a figure of 89.1% for Harlow district as a whole and 94.3% for Essex .

The second largest ethnic group was 'Percentage of usual residents who are Asian/Asian British' with $\underline{12.4 \text{ people (per 100 people)}}$ of the ward's population. That compares with $\underline{4.6\%}$ for the district as a whole and $\underline{2.5\%}$ for Essex.




The ethnic split of Little Parndon and Hare Street's residents in 2021 is shown below.



Households

In 2021 Little Parndon and Hare Street ward had $\frac{3,906}{100}$ households, which represent $\frac{10.32\%}{100}$ of Harlow's $\frac{37,857}{100}$ households. The household split by tenure is shown below.




The largest number of households lives in households rented from council or equivalent (%) accommodation with $\underline{27.6\%}$ of Little Parndon and Hare Street households. That compares with $\underline{23.9\%}$ for Harlow district as a whole and $\underline{7.2\%}$ for Essex.

The second largest number of households lives in households owned with a mortgage or loan (%)



accommodation with $\underline{26.1\%}$ of the ward's households. That compares with $\underline{30.7\%}$ for the district as a whole and $\underline{32.7\%}$ for Essex.

Education




<u>28.80 people (per 100 people)</u> of Little Parndon and Hare Street's residents have achieved level 4 qualifications and above compared to <u>24.44 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow as a whole and <u>20.98 people (per 100 people)</u> of Little Parndon and Hare Street's residents have no qualifications compared to <u>21.02 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow.

Health








In 2021 Little Parndon and Hare Street had $\underline{395}$ ($\underline{3.9}$ people (per 100 people)) residents that reported being in bad health and $\underline{112}$ ($\underline{1.1}$ people (per 100 people)) residents that reported being in very bad health.

Its ranking for the number of residents in very bad health is 3 (out of 11 Wards) within Harlow.
