

Basic facts about Mark Hall Ward





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This report provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic and socio-economic make-up of the Mark Hall ward within Harlow district. It looks at the population structure and provides information on the economic, housing and educational achievement of the ward.

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Mark Hall is one of the 11 Wards of Harlow. It has an area of $\underline{366}$ hectares which represents $\underline{11.98\%}$ of the total area of Harlow district .



Residents

The resident population of Mark Hall in 2021 was $\underline{7,965}$ which represents $\underline{8.53\%}$ of the total Harlow district resident population of $\underline{93,328}$.

Mark Hall's resident population is $\underline{4,112}$ ($\underline{51.6}$ people (per 100 people)) female and $\underline{3,853}$ ($\underline{48.4}$ people (per 100 people)) male.

Mark Hall has $\underline{403}$ households with dependent children aged 0 to 4. That represents $\underline{13.32\%}$ of the ward's households. $\underline{1,062}$ households in the ward have dependent children of all ages. That represents $\underline{33.00\%}$ of the ward's households.




Age

The predominant age band in Mark Hall in 2020 was 'population aged 5-9' with $\underline{588 \text{ people}}$ out of the total population of $\underline{7,965}$.

The mean age of the Mark Hall ward population was <u>39</u> years compared to a mean age of <u>38</u> years for residents in the whole of Harlow in 2011.

Population (unrounded) broken down by age band (5 year bands) (count) (Count) (2020) for Mark Hall




Ethnicity

The largest ethnic group in Mark Hall in 2021 was 'Percentage of usual residents who are White' with $84.0 \, \text{people}$ (per 100 people) of the ward's population. That compares with a figure of 89.1% for Harlow district as a whole and 94.3% for Essex .

The second largest ethnic group was 'Percentage of usual residents who are Black/African/Caribbean/Black British' with $\underline{6.2 \text{ people (per 100 people)}}$ of the ward's population. That compares with $\underline{4.6\%}$ for the district as a whole and $\underline{2.5\%}$ for Essex.




The ethnic split of Mark Hall's residents in 2021 is shown below.



Households

In 2021 Mark Hall ward had 3,218 households, which represent 8.50% of Harlow's 37,857 households. The household split by tenure is shown below.




The largest number of households lives in households rented from council or equivalent (%) accommodation with 36.9% of Mark Hall households. That compares with 23.9% for Harlow district as a whole and 7.2% for Essex.

The second largest number of households lives in households owned with a mortgage or loan (%)



accommodation with $\underline{24.5\%}$ of the ward's households. That compares with $\underline{30.7\%}$ for the district as a whole and $\underline{32.7\%}$ for Essex.


Education



21.36 people (per 100 people) of Mark Hall's residents have achieved level 4 qualifications and above compared to 24.44 people (per 100 people) in Harlow as a whole and 22.36 people (per 100 people) of Mark Hall's residents have no qualifications compared to 21.02 people (per 100 people) in Harlow.

Health






In 2021 Mark Hall had <u>387 (4.9 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in bad health and <u>111 (1.4 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in very bad health.

Its ranking for the number of residents in very bad health is 8 (out of 11 Wards) within Harlow.
