

Sumners and Kingsmoor is one of the 11 Wards of Harlow. It has an area of $\underline{253}$ hectares which represents $\underline{8.28\%}$ of the total area of Harlow district.



Residents

The resident population of Sumners and Kingsmoor in 2021 was $\underline{7,539}$ which represents $\underline{8.08\%}$ of the total Harlow district resident population of $\underline{93,328}$.

Sumners and Kingsmoor's resident population is <u>3,794</u> (<u>50.3 people (per 100 people</u>)) female and <u>3,745</u> (<u>49.7 people (per 100 people</u>)) male.

Sumners and Kingsmoor has $\underline{395}$ households with dependent children aged 0 to 4. That represents $\underline{13.48\%}$ of the ward's households. $\underline{981}$ households in the ward have dependent children of all ages. That represents $\underline{32.79\%}$ of the ward's households.




Age

The predominant age band in Sumners and Kingsmoor in 2020 was 'population aged 35-39' with 598 people out of the total population of 7,539.

The mean age of the Sumners and Kingsmoor ward population was <u>37</u> years compared to a mean age of <u>38</u> years for residents in the whole of Harlow in 2011.

Population (unrounded) broken down by age band (5 year bands) (count) (Count) (2020) for Sumners and Kingsmoor




Ethnicity

The largest ethnic group in Sumners and Kingsmoor in 2021 was 'Percentage of usual residents who are White' with $84.2 \, people \, (per \, 100 \, people)$ of the ward's population. That compares with a figure of 89.1% for Harlow district as a whole and 94.3% for Essex .

The second largest ethnic group was 'Percentage of usual residents who are Black/African/Caribbean/Black British' with 7.2 people (per 100 people) of the ward's population. That compares with 3.8% for the district as a whole and 1.3% for Essex.




The ethnic split of Sumners and Kingsmoor's residents in 2021 is shown below.



Households

In 2021 Sumners and Kingsmoor ward had <u>2,992</u> households, which represent <u>7.90%</u> of Harlow's <u>37,857</u> households. The household split by tenure is shown below.




The largest number of households lives in households owned with a mortgage or loan (%) accommodation with 30.3% of Sumners and Kingsmoor households. That compares with 30.7% for Harlow district as a whole and 32.7% for Essex.

The second largest number of households lives in households owned outright (%)



accommodation with $\underline{27.0\%}$ of the ward's households. That compares with $\underline{23.0\%}$ for the district as a whole and $\underline{36.3\%}$ for Essex.

Education



<u>20.81 people (per 100 people)</u> of Sumners and Kingsmoor's residents have achieved level 4 qualifications and above compared to <u>24.44 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow as a whole and <u>23.44 people (per 100 people)</u> of Sumners and Kingsmoor's residents have no qualifications compared to <u>21.02 people (per 100 people)</u> in Harlow.

Health



Residents broken down by level of health (%) % of residents reporting very good health 46.8 % of residents reporting good health 35.4 % of residents reporting fair health 12.6 % of residents reporting bad health 3.9 % of residents reporting very bad health 1.4

In 2021 Sumners and Kingsmoor had <u>297 (3.9 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in bad health and <u>108 (1.4 people (per 100 people)</u>) residents that reported being in very bad health.


Its ranking for the number of residents in very bad health is 10 (out of 11 Wards) within Harlow.
